## Police at last arrest the thief who committed theft at Vijay Chougule's house

NAVI MUMBAI:

Anurag Singh (20), the servant in the house of Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation's opposition leader Vijay Chougule, has been arrested for committing the theft of items worth around Rs 27 lakhs 40 thousand. Rabale police arrested him at Nepal Border. The police recovered from him 870 gms of gold worth Rs 1.5 lakhs, informed senior police inspector Pradip Tidar.



Shiv Sena leader and NMMC's opposition party leader Vijay Chougule resides in Yash Paradise Building at Airoli Sector 8. On 31 March, in the evening, he had gone out for some work along with his family. His servant Anurag Singh was alone in the house. Singh broke open the locker in the house and stole Rs 2.5 lakhs and 86 tola gold – all worth around 27 lakhs 40 thousand. The Chougule family arrived

home late at night and they became aware of the theft. Vijay Chougule lodged a complaint at Rabale police station. The police registered a criminal case of theft against Anurag Singh and then sent a squad to Varanasi at Uttar Pradesh to hunt for the culprit.

Deputy police inspector Ajay Kumbhar and his squad were hunting for Anurag Singh for around five days. Anurag Singh was

moving from one relative's place to another's. At last the police squad managed to nab him on Friday night. The police arrived with Anurag Singh in Navi Mumbai on Saturday after which he was made to appear in the court. The court remanded Anurag Singh to five day police custody, informed senior police inspector Pradip Tidar. He also said that the police had managed to confiscate from Anurag Singh 870 gms of jewellery and Rs 1.5 lakhs.

## New GIS substation to reduce black out woes

**ByTutu**

**NAVI MUMBAI:** The MSEDCL has proposed its owned state's first gas insulated substation to be set up at Tapal Naka in old Panvel. The indoor substation will reduce tripping of power besides increasing the feeder numbers. Sulfur hexafluoride gas is used as the insulating medium. Execution is slated to complete by March 2019.

The substation will change 33KV power to 22KV with two nos 10KVA transformer set up. The existing three feeders in the will be increased to eight feeders to reduce power outage to a minimum area whenever any tripping



occurs due to birds, rain etc. The Rs 9.35 cr gas insulated substation will serve 42000 consumers will come up before March 2019.

At present power supply is made from 33KV network near ONGC. Then it is converted to 22KV at Tapal Naka substation. With

only on transformer and three feeders power supply is made to consumers of Old Panvel.

The MSEDCL additional executive engineer Jaydeep Nanote said, "This is the first such experiment by MSEDCL as a public sector power player.

The tripping will be reduced as the GIS will be indoor free from birds and other threats. Further, the existing three feeders will be extended to eight feeders in Panvel. Whenever a power cut is effected a minimum area will be affected against a big area currently."

## Law is above everybody

The verdict has been given in the Salman Khan blackbuck case. Sentence of five years in jail has been awarded to actor Salman Khan for hunting blackbuck in Rajasthan. Stars like Khan, who is no stranger to controversy surrounding hunting expeditions, seem to think conservation is not serious business, That era is over. Will the verdict of the Jodhpur court survive the appeals process.

The Wildlife (Protection) Act, the landmark law from 1972 shields the diversity of India's endangered animals. Besides restraining 'VIP' poachers, forest guards must combat organised hunting gangs that employ traps and snares for a thriving trade in animals, body parts and trophies. The verdict in the Salman Khan case sends out the message that hunting of protected species is certain to invite severe penalties. Blood sports are grotesquely incongruous in the present day when environmental concerns rule supreme. This is a good verdict. No one is above law however high he or she may be.

The Wildlife Protection Act owes its existence to the perseverance of men who themselves were avid shikars in the days of the Raj. They greatly enjoyed the game till the time they realised the serious consequences of hunting wild life. It is then they took up cudgels against hunting. Salim Ali himself as a young boy shot a bird and then took it to Natural History Society, Bombay out of curiosity. Rest is history.

What will happen to Salman Khan in appeal? There are loopholes in every case and procedural law being what it is Salman may get away. But this conviction will remind all that animal protection is a serious business and the onus is on every single individual.

Television channels are focusing on his fans, but undermining the concern of the Bishnoi community, which respects animals and has stood for the cause of speech-less creatures and had faith in the judiciary over many years. His acquittal in the hit-and-run case was not welcomed by people, who may have also viewed his appointment as Goodwill Ambassador for Rio Olympics as 'political' or triggered by his fan following. But now, being sent to jail for five years, for killing a black buck 20 years ago is not palatable even to his critics.

The punishment has been meted was in accordance with the law. Law breakers will not escape punishment is what we learn from the Judgment pronounced. But it is beyond doubt that our justice delivery system is more time consuming and this case has travelled over 20 years to arrive at this conclusion. Justice delayed amounts to justice denied. So our justice delivery system should be time bound.

The punishment awarded to Mr Khan is befitting of the crime. Additionally, it also prompts the question about the application of law to the many unknown but possibly professional poachers of wildlife. Awarding punishment to Salman Khan for five years imprisonment may be as deterrent to others for killing wildlife animals. Further, nobody is above the rule of law.

Had it been an unknown person how many years jail would have been awarded? In fact, 'unknown persons' always have suffered the worst punishment. For example, how many such 'unknown persons' would have been allowed to drag the case for nineteen long years? How many 'unknown persons' would have had their bail appeal heard the very next day of the judgement?

The court makes the important observation that personalities who are capable of influencing the behaviour of others must naturally be conscious of what they do. The case will go all the way up to the Supreme Court and there is every likelihood that the rich and famous Salman Khan would be exonerated on some flimsy ground or the other as it has happened in the other four cases involving the same person.

'Stars' like Khan are supposed to lead by examples and not behave the way he has in the past. His past conduct is enough to get a clear picture of the kind of person he was and as for present, we all know the huge PR teams working on the so image of the famous film personalities. Those who cannot defend for themselves financially in the judicial probes that drag on for decades sometimes, are the only ones to suffer in reality.

Stardom, or any other form of social importance, does not confer impunity for any offence. The verdict has reiterated that no one is above law. Salman is a commercial product helping producers to make money. Film Stars should remember that people consider them as role models and hence they should be careful about their behaviour in the public forum. People should shun criminals but it is surprising they get elected to the legislatures and Parliament with massive majority.

The tehsildar has ordered probe into the same. The petrol pump was earlier in news for wrong doings.

The victim Uday Patil said, "I had gone to fill diesel in my 2004 model Innova car on Friday afternoon. At the Gagangiri petrol pump 65ltrs of diesel was filled and I had



paid for it. However the car tank capacity is 55 litres. Then I objected to it and complained against the petrol pump with the tehsildar and the police station."

The Karjat taluka supply officer Rajaram Mhatre said, "During our check we found the pump meter was rigged. Accordingly a report has been forwarded to the district collector and HPCL for action."

Uday Patil had also lodged complaint with the HPCL. The HPCL deputy general manag-

er retail Ramesh Bagh in his reply to Uday Patil says that the regional sales manager Raigad and mobile lab and quality control officer has been directed to investigate the issue. Also taking the investigation reports of tehsildar Karjat and police will be collected. Further action will be taken accordingly.

In the meanwhile, consumers of Karjat are arranging a massive protest against the petrol pump dealers next week on such meter rigging.

## Hunger strike to protest against HPCL pipeline

Earlier, the Raigad guardian minister has convened a meeting of the protesting villagers and authorities. However, no solution was reached out. The Raigad guardian minister could not reached out.

The district civil surgeon Dr Ajit Gawali upon learning the health condition of the striking people had sent a doctor to conduct a check-up. Even ambulance facility is not provided.

was caught in a vicious cycle. My mother and my best friend made efforts to get me off this habit".

I started feeling that if I don't show off this lifestyle, I have nothing to talk about, to anyone. When the likes, comments and retweets declined, I went into denial and felt like I was failing in life. I sought help from my friends and met a Therapist"

Dr Kedar Tilwe, Consultant, Psychiatrist Department Of Mental Health & Behavioural Sciences, Hiranandani Hospital, Vashi - A Fortis Network Hospital shares his views with the Newsband Correspondent on this burning topic. The excerpts are as below:

Too much involvement with social media can have its own repercussion's. So, as we use the platform to feel good and share our experiences, let's look at some of the drawbacks that we tend to ignore and forget:

A) The need to

present yourself in the best possible light to the world, forces us to edit, modify and sometimes even drastically alter our images, opinions and thoughts that we upload. In our endeavour to garner more appreciation we often forget that it is our little imperfections which make us unique and endearing

B) Self-esteem & self-worth which were your personal feelings are now measured by the number of likes, retweets and followers you generate

C) Experiences and memories are often only as good as the total views and comments they generate. Even the family meal is now rated on the basis of chatter on social sites rather than the way they taste!

D) Another area of concern is the altering of opinion on your own body-image as we try to imitate the perfect size figure or the most number of abs that is popular: often forgetting the limits of our body

E) The search for the perfect Selfie is fast becoming a public obsession and sometimes even a source of major accidents.

F) Cyberbullying and Trolling are new demons which make people feel battered and punitive

G) Most importantly we tend to erroneously substitute actual human connect for the online one; leading to strain and misunderstanding in our relationships.

The story is only as good as the 'Morals' we learn from it. So let's remember the tale of Snow White and try to empower ourselves to use the 'Mirror' and not become its slaves!
