CM acts on SOS against Parsik Hill Quarrying *Asks Environment dept to take action*

MUMBAI: Taking cognisance of environment activists' demand for stopping further quarrying of the much-ravaged Parsik Hills, Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has asked the Environment Department to look into the issue and take further action.

CM's office acknowledged the latest joint communiqué to Mr Devendra Fadnavis, along with three telling photographs of the destruction, from national communicators body

Public Relations Council of India (PRCI) and NGO Shree Ekvira Aai Pratishtan (SEAP) and said the Environment department has been asked to take action into it.

The destruction of Parsik Hills has reached the top of the hills and resulted in disappearance of couple of them, PRCI governing council chairman B N Kumar pointed out and expressed his happiness at the prompt response from Mr. Fadnavis.

SEAP head Nand-



kumar Pawar said "we hope to see some concrete action now from the government. The Chief Minister has at least responded to our SOS communiqué," he said.

Stressing that they are not opposed to

infrastructure development, PRCI and SEAP said: "it should not happen at the cost of the environment". "We are sure you and your government also give top priority to environment as enunciated by the Prime Minister himself," they said.

The Thane District Environment Impact Assessment Authority (DEIAA) has at its meeting in February called for a joint inspection of the Parsik Hill quarry sites by the Forest Department and CIDCO after the forest

officials bitterly complained about massive violations of quarrying. As against 136 hectares allotted for mining, as much as 248 hectares have been mined, as per the forest department.

During the joint inspection, CIDCO proposed that areas between two quarries could be considered for fresh quarrying permission. The Forest officials have, however, vehemently opposed any fresh quarrying. On the contrary to consider the entire mined areas as clusters, rightly so, the mail to Mr Fadnavis pointed out.

"We strongly feel – and it is a matter of commonsense – that areas between two quarry sites ought to have been badly impacted by blasting on either side," Pawar said.

The forest officials have now understood to have referred the issue to the Maharashtra Government level officers at Mantralaya for guidance. "It in this context that we appealed for the CM's intervention and disallow any further quarrying and stop further destruction of

the Parsik Hills, Kumar said.

In fact, several stake holders including Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, several former CIDCO officials and ex-BMC Commissioner Mr Subodh Kumar have all vehemently opposed further quarrying of Parsik Hills as it would cause massive air pollution, the mail to the Chief Minister said.

Moreover, the quarry owners themselves have realized the environmental damage done by the plundering of the hills. They have requested CIDCO for alternative sites.

"We, therefore, fail to understand uncalled-for over enthusiasm on part of CIDCO in resuming quarrying of Parsik Hills when the whole world is opposed to it," Pawar said.

"CIDCO is already blasting the hills in Navi Mumbai International Airport area and this material could well be used for the project. Additional material could be procured from other places. But let us not flatten Parsik Hills for the airport project," the mail said.

U-16 National Team Gears Up For AFC U-16 Championship

To Play against Asian powerhouses Iraq, Japan among others

The Indian U-16 National Team will be locking horns with defending AFC U-16 champions Iraq, Asian powerhouses Japan, a strong Jordan and Yemen in the 5th WAFF U-16 Boys Championship slated to be held at the King Abdullah II International Stadium in Jordan from August 1.

The exposure tour has been arranged by All India Football Federation in coordination with the Sports Authority of India, aiming at providing a "fool-proof" preparation to the U-16 boys who play in the AFC U-16 Championship Malaysia 2018 in September 2018.

The tournament in Jordan comes on the back of the team's exposure tours to China, Thailand and Malaysia where the boys played six matches against U-16 National Teams and more against Club sides since July.

the coach an opportunity to play against teams who have qualified for the 2018 Championship. If all goes as per plan in August, we would have played against half the Championship-qualified teams

at least once," said Abhishek, the former Indian Senior National Team captain. He further added "The significance of this tournament lies in the fact that it brings together teams qualified for the 2018

Programme to be led by one of Europe's renowned Obesity, Metabolic and Bariatric Surgeon

Apollo Hospitals Navi Mumbai today announced the launch of a comprehensive Obesity and Bariatric Surgery programme led by one of Europe's renowned Obesity, Metabolic and Bariatric surgeon, Dr. Vigyan Jain, along with Internal Medicine Consultant, Dr. Sanjay Khare. The programme would take a one-of-its-kind approach in redefining obesity care and would be supported by a team of clinical nutritionists, physiotherapists and psychologists.

Dr. Vigyan Jain, Consultant, Obesity and Bariatric Surgeon, said, "Obesity is today a burgeoning lifestyle problem and a major health risk in that it can lead non-communicable diseases like diabetes, heart disease and cancer. Globally today, an estimated 1.5 billion adults are overweight or obese and this is expected to rise



to more than 3 billion people by 2030. India today has over 30 million people with obesity and this is expected to rise to 70 million by 2025. A sedentary lifestyle reinforced by a carbohydrate-heavy and oil-rich Indian diet are the main contributing factors. The cost of this obesity is high as the expenditure on treating the diseases that arise from obesity are huge. The Obesity and Bariatric Surgery programme at Apollo Hospitals will address

this major issue providing comprehensive management and treatment for obesity and related conditions."

Obesity is a medical condition caused due to the accumulation of excessive body fat. It can be measured by Body Mass Index (BMI), which is a ratio of weight to height and indicates the amount of body fat. As per the World Health Organization (WHO), the healthy range for BMI is between 18.5 and 24.9, with a BMI of 25

to 29.9 putting an individual into the overweight zone. However, the concern area comes in with a BMI of 30 or higher which is defined as obesity and globally, about 34 percent of the world's adult population are overweight or obese.

The management and treatment for obesity needs to take a comprehensive view of the patient's condition. The main approach is a long term program of diet and exercise, with a goal to reach and stay

at a healthy weight. However in certain cases, medication may need to be prescribed for weight loss. If these methods are not working out and in cases of extreme obesity with BMI of 40 and higher or a BMI above 35 with health problems such as diabetes or high blood pressure, weight loss surgery, that is, bariatric surgery can help.

Elaborating on bariatric surgery, Dr. Vigyan Jain said, "Bariatric surgery can give magi-

cal results. Bariatric surgery works on the concept of causing weight loss by restricting the amount of food the stomach can hold, causing malabsorption of nutrients, or by a combination of both gastric restriction and malabsorption. Most weight loss surgeries today are performed using minimally invasive techniques like laparoscopic surgery. The Obesity and Bariatric Surgery programme will provide surgical options for patients that will include the gold standard of weight loss surgery, which is the Gastric Bypass. This is a complex operation in which a small pouch is created from the stomach and connected to the small intestine. After the surgery, the stomach will be smaller and the patient will feel full with less food. This will result in restriction of calorie intake and promote weight loss."

Amending the SC/ST Act was unavoidable

The Centre had no choice but to amend the SC/ST Act. The Union Cabinet's decision to amend the provisions of the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act appears both reasonable and unavoidable. The massive Scheduled Caste protests against the Supreme Court verdict that was perceived as diluting the provisions of the 1989 law and the call for a nationwide shutdown on August 9 made the Centre act quickly.

The proposed amendments are aimed at undoing three new rules laid down by the court. From the very beginning it was clear that the entire issue had less to do with the correctness of the Supreme Court judgment and more to do with the way it was interpreted, and sometimes deliberately misinterpreted. The Court was at pains to emphasise that it was only seeking to protect the innocent against arbitrary arrest. The Court's concerns about what it saw as misuse of the Act resulted in the perception that it was introducing norms to prevent quick action on complaints.

Upper caste "political Hindus" say that there is no casteism among the "Hindus" or, it is "fast disappearing". In India every issue is governed by vote bank politics and a non-issue was made a big issue by the opposition jockeying for Dalit votes. Just look at the reaction of Congress to the Bill brought in now. They want to milk it to the maximum for their own survival. So long as we have such politicians willing to stoop to any level for a few more votes, we will never see political parties reacting to issues in the real interest of the country. Look at Mamata and TMC reacting to the NRC! They only see votes in it and not peace of the country. Certainly, problems can be solved by addressing them in a civil manner rather than provoking the people and threatening a civil war! Congress never had the guts to bring in game changers like GST or address the NRC issue, but they certainly know how to oppose it for their political gains. It is never 'India first' for any political party. It is only votes first!

The misinterpretation of the Supreme Court judgement leads to all this howling. Whereas on the other hand it was a very wise and thoughtful judgement given by the Court to curb (if there is any) the misuse of the act. As the motto of our justice system is to save the innocent even if in lieu few wrongdoers remain free.

There is no denying of the fact that "SCs and STs, whose rights should be protected" - for the the "dignity of the disadvantaged, who have suffered unspeakably as a result of the abhorrent practice of social discrimination." Law must be enforced to protect SC/ST but until & unless there is a very strong social reform movement minus vote bank politics the attitude towards SC/ST will not change. Current hotch-potch on act is nothing more than a political drama. If atrocities on St/SC are reality then how this law was useful all these days?

The atrocities caused by false cases is also a bitter reality. Compulsory jail sentences with no inquiry or conclusive proof takes place in dictatorships and banana republics and not in any democracy worth its salt. Politicians of all hues have been pandering to the majority groups only for votes. The judiciary has come to the rescue to safeguard basic rights. The media must rise to the occasion and stress the importance of protecting constitutional rights instead of buckling under pressure. Genuine atrocities against the Dalits or any group must be dealt with firmly. But this must not be done by eroding the civil rights of other citizens. Historical wrong doings cannot be offered as an excuse for doing so. The amendment is a needed one to preserve the SC/ST people from atrocities on caste discrimination and to safeguard their rights.

Provision of representation of minorities in the constitution of India is anomalous, amend it. Stop the practice of printing caste and religion in SSLC. If guaranteed fundamental rights are sustainable, ban the twin progenies of democracy viz corruption and reservation. If Merit is disregarded, below average persons will teach our children, treat our parents and guide us in parliament and legislature. Let there be a future devoid of fear, where head is held high, each citizen identified by their eminence and never by caste or religion. The government should rise above vote bank politics and address the immediate grievance of meritorious of the country who are unfortunately included in the general category. Birth is destiny, it is God's will. Segregation implied by reference to roots is blasphemous. End corruption and reservation, guarantee parity between sermon and practice. Racial discrimination in disguise of quota is apartheid. Father of nation led campaigns against apartheid in South Africa. Intolerance is bred by quota. Ban it. Save our nation!

UP Trans-Harbour line services for Thane leaving Panvel from 10.12 am to 4.26 pm and DN Trans-Harbour line services to Panvel leaving Thane from 11.14 am to 4.00 pm will also remain cancelled. MHSMC president and her husband cum group leader face disqualification over illegal construction

After chief officer submits report with evidence; Revenge taken through passing no trust motion against Sagar Gholap

NAVI MUMBAI: The Matheran hill station municipal council president Prerna Sawant and her husband cum group leader Prasad Sawant are facing disqualification based on a request by a social worker to the Raigad collector. A social activist Raghunath Kadam pointed out that the duo obstructed the municipal council chief officer led demolition squad from executing their duty on May 31, 2018 at Horseland Hotel. The municipal council chief officer Sagar Gholap and team had to demolish illegal structures to file report to the National Green Tribunal. The BEAG Mumbai has dragged the collector, municipal council, state government to NGT and others over illegal construction in the popular hill station area.

Around a week after the chief officer Sagar Gholap submit the factual report citing evidence the Shiv Sena majority



house sensing disqualification trimiuble passed a no confidence resolution against Sagar Gholap. This has been widely criticised by people saying good officers are not allowed to work but elected representatives trouble them. The government should not bow to the Shiv Sena pressure to transfer the chief officer.

The National Green Tribunal on January 10, 2018 had ordered all constructions and illegal encroachments after February 4, 2003 should be demolished. The BEAG has filed the

PIL in the NGT. Hence the municipal council took action in compliance with the order.

The social activist Raghunath Kadam in his letter to Raigad collector has alleged that the chief officer Sagar Gholap along with others had gone to demolish illegal structures inside the Horseland hotel. The municipal council president Prerna Sawant and councilor Prasad Sawant had obstructed them from taking action. Hence

treatments will be given to every patient, he said.

BJP taluka president Arunsheth Bhagat said, "The inauguration of this grand camp will be done by State's port, medical education, information and technology, food and town supply, consumer protection minister and Raigad's guardian minister Ravindra Chavan. Present during this occasion will be former MP Ramsheth Thakur, JNPT's trustee Mahesh Baldi,

Panvel's mayor Dr Kavita Choutmol, deputy mayor Charushila Gharat and others.

The Grand Camp will start at 9 am and will last till 2 pm. The camp will have more than 250 Specialty and Super Specialty Hospitals' specialists who will be treating the patients and distributing medicines free of cost. The camp will treat ailments which are common, children's, women's, skin's, heart, dental, diabetic, ENT, bones, cataract etc. There will also be surgeries done, spectacles distributed, and there are arrangements

done for treating pregnant women who are suffering from cancer.

There will be Prime Minister Insurance Scheme given to poor and needy patients. All the expenses of these patients will be borne by Shri Ramsheth Thakur Samajik Vikas Mandal, informed BJP's district spokesperson Y T Deshmukh.

The doctors who will be treating the patients will be those belonging to big hospitals of Mumbai and Navi Mumbai and they will be assisted by more than 300 volunteers.

Cracks appear in Sahyadri Wadi hamlet in Mahad

NAVI MUMBAI: Big cracks have appeared in the Sahyadri wadi area of Ambe Shivtar village atop Sahyadri hills in Mahad around mid July threatening a hamlet. The cracks are found around in a 3km long area.

Around 75 population hamlet do not have a road. The high school students have to trek 5 km each to and fro daily to attend their classes. The Raigad district administration is yet to plan their rehabilitation. Raigad Zilla Parishad and local panchayat Samiti members demanded their rehabilitation.

An activist Dipak Salunkhe said, "The Sahyadri Wadi is located around 35 km away from Mahad under Ambe Shivtar village in the Sahyadri hill range.

Cracks were appeared during 2005 torrential rain and on July 18, 2018. The recent cracks are stretched on a 3km area. The tribal hamlet with 20 families having a population of 74 is living between the two crack areas. Any disaster will force the



district administration to conduct a massive challenging operation in the hill area."

The villagers are dependent upon step farming and animal husbandry. The hamlet have a Raigad Zilla Parishad primary school with 13 students but 22 high school students trek 5km each to and fro for their study. The primary school teacher Rahul Dhote also treks a similar distance daily to reach the school.

A resident Bhau Kachare said, "We have requested the tehsildar and sub divisional officer to relocate the hamlet to a safe location but in vain. Earth quake also hit the village." The

Raigad Zilla Parishad member Manoj Kalijkar has assured the tribals to raise their rehabilitation issue in the Zilla Parishad.

The Mahad Sub divisional magistrate Vitthal Inamdar said, "The families have been relocated to a safe place down the hills during the monsoon. We are considering their rehabilitation."

Upon learning about their woes the MMCETP has reached out to the tribals by offering them carpet, mosquito curtains etc. Also a health check up camp was organised. The tribals are apprehensive about their future in absence of rehabilitation.

their positions should be cancelled ie disqualified.

The Raigad collector has sought a report from the Matheran chief officer Sagar Gholap. In the report Sagar Gholap confirmed the obstructions made by the duo and has recommended action against them under Municipal Act sec 44 and MRTP Act. The chief officer was allegedly threatened by the duo in presence of police, locals, tehsildar, deputy SP, et al. A video footage has been submitted. Sagar Gholap confirmed the same and said, "We could not even start the demolition drive and returned."

Prerna Sawant said, "My husband

(Prasad) is the manager of Horseland Hotel and there was a Puja which I attended with him. The complainant and the chief officer are targeting us. There are many issues of development but not done. The allegation is politically motivated after the electoral loss of one of

his relatives of the complainant. The complainant was not present when the drive was conducted." The Raigad collector will soon serve notice to the duo to hear them. The video footage will serve as an evidence which may create trouble for the couple.
