Taloja MIDC monitoring committee meeting held

NAVI MUMBAI: The first meeting of monitoring committee of the Taloja MIDC area was held recently. The committee was formed as per the directive of NGT to look into the various aspects of pollution in Taloja MIDC. The committee headed by retired Bombay HC judge VM Kanade is to prepare an action plan with a target of ensuring compliance of prescribed standards. The MIDC, Taloja CETP, Taloja Manufacturers Association, MPCB and CIDCO made presentations before the committee. However, the NGT complainant have expressed his displeasure for not inviting him to the meeting.

In the meeting justice VM Kanade had explained about environment and present condition. He informed all those present in the meeting to prepare an

action plan with target of ensuring compliance of prescribed standards.

The MIDC presented an overview of the industrial estate, key statistics and role of MIDC in development and maintenance of infrastructure. The CETP upgradation plant costing Rs 74cr with 25 percent of the cost to be borne by the industries and balance by state government/MIDC. Justice V M Kanade asked the chairman Taloja CETP society to give the NOC which the later agreed.

The Taloja CETP society put forward its views on issues, challenges for compliance and strategic plans. The Taloja Manufacturers Association presented an overview of the challenges to small and large scale industries in environmental compliance besides sug-

Clinic To Minimize Cases Of 'Heart Failures' Launched On The Occasion Of World Heart Day

NAVI MUMBAI: As per the statistics disseminated by one of the nation leading network of Hospitals in health care, every 3rd patient who requires ICU admission in Navi Mumbai, for any cardiac ailment, suffers from Heart Failure. Timely diagnosis, treatment and awareness are yet deficient. To address this concern, and in observance of World Heart Day '18, Former Thane District Guardian Minister, Ganesh Naik inaugurated a dedicated 'Heart Failure Clinic' at Hiranandani Hospital Vashi - A Fortis Network Hospital on Saturday 29th September, 2018.

The same will be managed by a team of experienced Doctors and nursing staff including a Physician, Critical Care Physician (Intensivist), Cardiologist and Cardiothoracic Surgeon who will provide timely diagnosis and individual care to the patients in order to prevent a possibility of Heart Failure. This severe condition, also known as Congestive Heart Failure occurs when the heart muscles does not pump effectively due to various reasons, further damaging the heart.

"Heart Failure is the most common cause of death in cardiac patients. Most reasons causing Heart Failure are correctable or reversible; with recent medications, device therapies and heart transplant. With Navi Mumbai population growing rapidly, there is need for a comprehensive centre that takes care of all cardiac concerns under one roof," shared Dr Brajesh Kumar Kunwar, Interventional Cardiologist, Hiranandani Hospital, Vashi-A Fortis Network Hospital, who will be spearheading the state of the art, Heart Failure Clinic along with Dr Chandrashekhar Tulasigeri, Director-Dept. of Intensive Care Medicine,

"The main objective behind this Clinic is to identify the probable causes of Heart Failure at a very early stage and take corrective actions through medical and lifestyle management in order to prevent the possibility of cardiac arrest due to heart attack in patients because of various symptoms or ailments. The

same will only improve the patients' quality of life and will be achieved by monitoring them at regular intervals," said Dr Chandrashekhar Tulasigeri, Director-Dept. of Intensive Care Medicine.

Dr Bhaskar Semitha, Consultant Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgeon trained in Australia added "By maintaining records of patients over a period of

India should focus more on Export

The Centre has taken a decision to increase customs duty on imports of 19 "non-essential" items. Will this narrow the current account deficit (CAD)? The impact of this tariff increase in paring the import bill and thus containing the CAD is at best going to be short-term and marginal. Also the decision to double import duties on a clutch of consumer durables to 20% could dampen consumption of these products. Already the rupee's slide against the dollar is already likely to have made these goods costlier.

A more robust approach in addressing the widening CAD would be to institute wide-ranging measures to boost exports and simultaneously reduce the import-intensity of the economy. Ensure that export growth starts outpacing the expansion in merchandise imports.

Hiking the import duties is surely not a very effective solution. It attracts counter hikes in retaliation by other nations. Efforts must be focused to push up exports to reduce CAD. At the same time production and employment opportunities require to be generated further to boost up the economy.

The hyped 'Make in India' should have been 'Export, Export from India'. We now know Make in India is for special big-ticket zone. Secondly, no member of the Team had ever discussed or commented or self-praised to have helped in facilitating exports. Only agenda is on trivial issues: what to eat, what to sing, what to celebrate. As highlighted, with tariff-war underway, many countries in SE Asia have wooed factories from China to their shores offering incentives etc.

The centre must avoid these knee-jerk reactions, instead focus on proper well-thought-out and then implemented measures to tackle the perennial inflating CAD.

While on one side our nation is engrossed in such unnecessary controversial fights on Ayodhya/Sabarimala/Adultery/Hindi with almost zero scientific and economic sense/values, on the other side, India (with its leaders having very poor understanding of the Strengths) is seen wasting over 99.5% of our superb resources.

India must immediately work on OWN RESOURCES indigenous development, so that imports and dependence on outside technologies are averted. VALUE ADDITION of Resources would be the key to so-called CAD. There is also need to nurture Brain-power utilization to stem the migration of educated youngsters to outside nations.

The verdict by the Supreme Court in Sabarimala case unfortunate!

The BJP's pro-Hindutvavadi Government should protect Hindus' traditions by legislating an Act in the Parliament!

The Supreme Court has given the verdict to allow entry of women of all age groups in Sabarimala Temple. We respect the Supreme Court; however, the verdict of the Court is unfortunate. The women have been given a place of Goddess in Hindu Dharma and are worshipped. Still, it is beyond comprehension that the 800-years-old tradition of Hindus is discarded on the basis of a petition concerned with Hindu Dharma filed by Naushad Ahmed Khan, President of Indian Young Lawyers' Association. However, the petitioner does not file a petition against a ban on entry of women belonging to his own Islam religion in mosques. The decisions on any religious matters should be taken only on the basis of the Scriptures; however, it is, unfortunately, not followed, and moreover, such instances occur only in case of Hindus only, which is very sorry state of affairs. A few months back, the Bombay High Court has passed a verdict to allow entry of women on the platform of Deity Shani in Shri Shani Shingnapur, Maharashtra; however, barring a few so-called progressives, thousands of faithful women devotees from surrounding towns still avoid entry on the platform. In a similar manner, the women devotees would also abide by the tradition of Dharma in Sabarimala temple, averred Mr. Ramesh Shinde, the Spokesperson of Hindu Janajagruti Samiti.

The Constitution has given right of religious freedom to everyone; the same is applicable to Hindus and their temples also. Because of the above verdict, the right to abide by Dharma is being infringed. Such rules of banning entry to women exist only in very few temples in India, women are free to enter in the rest of temples. Still, a misleading propaganda is being spread.

One of the judges on the Bench of 5 judges which delivered the verdict was a woman judge, and she has given opposite opinion. About this, it cannot be said that the 4 men judges have taken the decision by overlooking the opinion of a women judge. In the similar fashion, we cannot treat the decision to ban the entry of women in the temple as male chauvinism. Earlier, the Congress Government in Shahabano case and also the present Government in Atrocity case had legislated the Acts in the Parliament to change the verdicts given by the Supreme Court. In a similar manner, the Central Government should legislate an Act to allow the decision to be taken regarding any religious matter of Hindus according to the Hindu Scriptures and protect the Hindu culture, demanded Mr. Shinde.

As per Hindu culture, adultery is immoral and punishable only!

The Supreme Court has also given yesterday only that extra-marital relations is not an offence. As per Hindu culture, adultery is immoral, and it is punishable only. Just because the adultery is not considered as an offence in the countries such as the US, China, Japan, etc., we also should not consider it as an offence is beyond comprehension. The Indian laws should be framed as per Indian culture. Such verdicts may give a sort of license for committing adultery, which would create serious effects on society in the future, feared Mr. Ramesh Shinde.

NERUL: Terna Speciality Hospital & Research Centre, Nerul organized a CPR Training program & laughter therapy on the occasion of World Heart Day for the Navi Mumbai police. 150 Police Officers found the training program to be significant, interesting and participated enthusiastically.

The training programme was conducted by Dr. Archana Mhatre, Anesthesiologist. The highlight of this training program was the session on the Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) techniques conducted by Dr. Mhatre. Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation is a lifesaving technique useful in medical emergencies such as heart attack, in which someone's breathing



or heartbeat has stopped. CPR is performed in an effort to manually revive the heart pumping and thereby restore brain function until further measures are taken to restore spontaneous blood circulation and

breathing in a person who is in cardiac arrest.

On this occasion cardiologist from hospital Dr. Mahesh Ghogare said, "In our society many people dies due to sudden heart attack but there



is no awareness about CPR program among us, so on the occasion of World Heart Day we decided to make awareness about Life Saving Course which is (CPR) and coming year we will try to reach at least 2000

thought. Medical emergencies can strike anytime, anywhere – even on roads – and in most cases, medical assistance is not immediately available. Hence, medical professionals recommend first aid, a temporary help given to a victim before professional medical help can be provided. This timely assistance is most critical to victims, and in most cases, it turns out to be life-saving."

After CPR training holder of Limca laughter records Mr. Kishore H. Kuvavala has conducted laughter therapy for police staff where he gave small tips how to keep away from mental stress which also cause heart diseases.
